## TIP 411" - COMPLETELY ANONYMOUS POLICE TIPS

The **Saukville Police Department** has launched "**SKPD Tips**" (tip 411 anonymous tips) app for Android and iPhone devices that enables the public to send anonymous tips to the police and lets the police respond back, creating a two-way anonymous "chat".

Developed by CitizenObserver, a St. Paul MN company, **SKPD Tips** puts a powerful new crime fighting tool into the hands of our community for all ages and demographics. This technology is available to our citizens free of charge. The "**SKPD Tips**" app can be downloaded online at the Google Play Store, iTunes App Store or by visiting the Police Departments website at <http://www.village.saukville.wi.us/Police/>



Citizens can also send an anonymous tip to **Saukville Police Department** by texting the word **SKPD** and their tip to **847411**. Anonymous web tips can be submitted from the Police Departments website at <http://www.village.saukville.wi.us/Police/> by clicking on the "**Tip 411**" heading, or online at <http://www.citizenobserver.com/cov6/app/webTipForm.html?id=10873>. It's 100% anonymous. CitizenObserver's technology removes all identifying information before the police department sees it so there's no way to identify the sender.

## DOG AND CAT LICENSE RENEWALS

All Village of Saukville residents owning a cat or dog that is older than six months are required by Village Ordinance to purchase a pet license. 2015 licenses can be purchased between December 15, 2014 and March 31, 2015. A late penalty will be imposed for pet license processing after March 31, 2015.

### Dog License fees:

- \$8.00 spayed/neutered
- \$10.00 not spayed/neutered
- \$5.00 late penalty after March 31<sup>st</sup>.

### Cat License fees:

- \$5.00 spayed/neutered
- \$7.00 not spayed/neutered
- \$3.00 late penalty after March 31<sup>st</sup>.

## VILLAGE'S TRASH & RECYCLING SERVICE

- Roll out trash and recycle carts are provided to residential households by **Advanced Disposal - 800-387-0949**.
- Collection - every Thursday (Friday when a holiday falls M-Th that week)
- Carts must be placed curbside **by 7:00 a.m.** on pick-up day. Carts must face the street as indicated by the arrow, be fully accessible, and be placed with a minimum of three feet of space between carts and/or obstacles.
- Recycle Collection - alternate Thursdays - collection dates can be found on the Village website, Time Warner Cable Access Channel 25, at Village Hall, and Oscar Grady Library.
- All recyclable materials can be placed in the same recycle cart.
- Any trash or recyclable materials placed curbside in any container other than the carts will not be collected.
- Carts are the property of Advanced Disposal and must remain at the residence should you move.
- If you experience damage to your cart, please call Advanced Disposal for repair or replacement.
- **The 2015 trash/recycling collection fee will be \$171 per residential unit. The last increase for this service was 2012. This fee will be added to your 2014 Property Taxes as a separate line item.**



Large Item Pick-up Service: You must arrange for special pick-up by Advanced Disposal or take items to the *Drop-off Site at 803 North River Road, West Bend*. There is a fee for large item disposal. Call (800-387-0949) for prices and information.

Electronic devices cannot be disposed of in your household trash cart. These devices include, but are not limited to:

- Computers, monitors, printers and peripherals; fax machines and photocopiers
- Televisions, video screens, telephones with video displays; VCR & DVD players

The nearest collection center for disposal of these items is Veolia ES Technical Solutions, 1275 Mineral Springs Drive, Port Washington.

Hours: Mondays - 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.; 262-243-8998. There will be a fee charged for electronics disposal.



## ATTENTION TAXPAYERS

The **full amount, or the first installment, of your property tax bill** is due and payable to the Village of Saukville Treasurer by January 31, 2015 to avoid any penalties.

Second installment payments are due and payable to the Ozaukee County Treasurer by July 31, 2015.

In order to deduct your property tax payment off of your 2014 income taxes, it must be paid by December 31, 2014. Personal property taxes and special assessments included on a property tax bill are due to the Village Treasurer by January 31, 2015 and may not be paid in installments.

(Open December 31<sup>st</sup> until 3:00 p.m.)

## BMO HARRIS BANK (Saukville Branch)

(Open December 31<sup>st</sup> until 3:00 p.m.)

Must pay inside - not at drive-through tellers. Bring your tax bill to process payment. Refunds can be processed immediately.

## AUTOMATIC CHECKING OR CREDIT CARD

ACH and credit card payments are accepted through the Official Payments link on our website. There is a convenience fee of \$2.75 (transactions less than \$10,000) or \$15.00 (transactions \$10,000 or greater) for using an ACH direct pay checking account. Credit card payment charge is **2.75% of the total tax payment**. ### NEW BUSINESS MOVING TO GREEN BAY AVE.

**Camping World** has opened and continues to attract increased visitors and attention to the area. Camping World is America's largest direct marketer and specialty retailer of RV and outdoor camping accessories and services.

**Cleaning Plus**, full service cleaning, is now located in Conservancy Court.

**O'Reilly's Auto Parts** has received Plan Commission approval to construct an auto parts retail store on Hwy 33 and Green Bay Road. O'Reilly's has grown from one store in 1957 to over 4,257 locations today. Construction of a new store will begin in Saukville in 2015.

**Kwik Trip** gas and convenience store is currently preparing their new site at Hwy 33 and Foster Drive for construction in Spring 2015.

The Village has partnered with Port Washington State Bank to offer a loan program for business development and revitalization. ## **HOW DO I DISPOSE OF...??**

How often have you cleaned out the basement or garage and found yourself looking at items you didn't know what to do with? Old tires, a broken lawnmower, car parts, auto batteries, waste oil, clothes, to name a few? The local waste hauler will not accept many of these items. Don't despair; there are inexpensive and locally available means to get rid of this stuff without much hassle.



- Tires - local automotive service centers. Most will charge a nominal fee.
- Vehicles and auto parts (lead acid batteries, sheet metal, motors, transmissions, etc.) - local scrap dealers. Some may pay for the item(s).
- White Goods or other "recyclables" – local scrap dealers such as Port Recycling, 782 Schmitz Dr., Port Washington – 262-284-4060.
- Waste Oil - County Highway Dept. drop-off site at 410 Spring Street in Port Washington. Some of the local automotive service centers will also take it. **OIL CANNOT BE CONTAMINATED WITH ANTI-FREEZE, SOLVENTS, OR OTHER VOLATILE FLUIDS.**
- Furniture, bedding - if it is clean and in good shape, resale St. Vincent de Paul or Goodwill shops may accept the items. Otherwise, arrange for a special pickup with Advanced Disposal or haul to their site in West Bend.
- Household Hazardous Waste – kitchen and bathroom, garage and workshop, home and garden products – take to the Ozaukee Co. Hazardous Waste Collection Site at 1275 Mineral Springs Dr., Port Washington. This site is open on Mondays only. Call 262-243-8998 for more information.
- Untreated, clean lumber - cut up and place in cart or burn in fire place or wood stove. Remove nails or hardware.
- Treated lumber, railroad ties, and lumber containing creosote - call waste hauler such as Advanced Disposal to arrange for dumpster or pickup.
- Clothing and other apparel - Check with local churches or charities that accept donations, or take to St. Vincent de Paul or Goodwill stores.
- Rechargeable tool and cell phone batteries (Ni-CaD, Nickel Metal Hydride) - Saukville Police Dept. at 262-284-0444.

**Remember... Dumping oil, anti-freeze, solvents, cleaners, paint, fuel, and other solids or liquids in storm sewers is ILLEGAL and can lead to substantial fines and jail time.**

## CURBSIDE CHIPPING - Every Monday through Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup>

- 3 inch diameter maximum branches.
- Pick-up starts at 6:30 a.m. on Mondays. The crew will make only one pass per side of the street per chipping event.
- Limit of 20 minutes per address (duplexes considered a single address) after which a \$25 fee will be charged to the property owner for each additional 20 minutes at the owner's request.

- Includes garden waste, leaves, lawn rakings and small tree or bush stumps. Bring to the Compost Disposal Site at the Public Works Garage.
- VILLAGE RESIDENTS ONLY.
- NO BRANCHES/BRUSH drop-off at the compost site.

## LEAF COLLECTION

- Curbside leaf collection runs **October 1<sup>st</sup> through November 28<sup>th</sup>** weather permitting. No guaranteed or scheduled pick-up.
- Leaf piles must be curbside with **no brush or plant materials**.
- Keep vehicles off leaf piles or leaves will not be collected.
- Keep piles a manageable height for the vacuum truck to manage.

## SNOWPLOW SAFETY

Treat the snowplow crews with courtesy and caution! Keeping clear of their operations allows them to do their job quickly and efficiently.



- Do not park on the street if you see a plow approaching.
- Don't pull out in front of a plow at the last second.
- Keep at least 300 feet of distance from the rear of a plow as it may stop or back up without warning.

## CHRISTMAS TREE CHIPPING


Christmas trees will be chipped curbside by the Public Works Department on **Mondays, January 12<sup>th</sup> and January 19<sup>th</sup>**. The following rules apply: Remove all decorations, wire, tinsel, hardware, lights, and stands from tree - no cloth, paper, or plastic cover bags. Place trees curbside no sooner than 24 hours prior to the day of chipping and no later than 7:00 a.m. that day. Do not bury the trees in snow. The chipper will make only one pass per street side per chipping event. Disposal of trees prior to or after the scheduled dates will be the homeowner's responsibility. *Do not put trees out for regular trash pick-up. They will not be picked-up.*

## MAILBOX WINTER READINESS

Village plow crews do their best to avoid damaging mailboxes, but it still happens on occasion. It is not the Village's policy to repair damaged mailboxes. In most cases, a strong post and secure mailbox will withstand the impact of snow coming off of the snowplow. Experience has shown that most mailbox damage occurs when the mailbox projects too far into the street or the posts are rotten or weak. Keeping the furthest projection of the mailbox at least two (2) inches behind the back of the concrete curb is recommended. Wood and metal pipe are the only allowable post materials. Brick or concrete posts are **not** allowed for motorists and cyclists safety reasons.

# Emergency Management - Winter Preparedness

**Are you prepared?** Now is the time to review your winter preparedness - before the snow flies...

- Check the contents of your emergency kits, for home and vehicles; replace items that were used or are outdated;
- Check vehicles to ensure they are ready for the abuse winter weather will bring.
- Have your furnace inspected. When was the last time you had the fireplace chimney checked and cleaned?
- Do you have a carbon monoxide detector? When did you last replace the batteries in it or in your smoke detectors?

Review your family emergency plan. Is it up to date; are the contact numbers current; do you have them programmed in all your phones? When was the last time you sat down and reviewed your plan with family members?


Plan your travels and check the latest weather reports to avoid storms. Keep your gas tank near full to avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines. Carry a winter storm survival kit in your vehicle that includes:

- \* Blankets or sleeping bags
- \* Flashlight with extra batteries
- \* First-Aid Kit
- \* Shovel, tools, booster cables, and windshield scraper
- \* High-calorie non-perishable food & something to drink
- \* Sand or cat litter to use for traction


## AS THE SNOW FALLS...

The **Village of Saukville Public Works Department** reminds all Village property owners that resident cooperation is essential to the success of winter snow removal operations.



Residents can help in the following areas:

- **Trash/Recycling Cart Placement:** Cart must be placed with lid opening facing the street and at the back of curb line or street shoulder, with a minimum of 3 feet between cart(s) or other obstructions. Do not place carts beyond the curb line into the street area.



- **Utilize your driveway or clear an area along the side of your driveway to safely place your recycling and refuse container.** Maintaining proper clearances as shown below will make it safer and easier for collection personnel and automated equipment to efficiently empty your containers.
- **Do not shovel or blow snow into the street.** This creates a hazardous condition for motorists and may require return trips by the snowplow to clear the street. In addition, State Statutes and Village Ordinances prohibit this action and doing so may result in a fine.
- **Shovel snow to the right-hand side of your driveway as you face the street.** This helps to reduce the amount of snow pushed into your driveway by snowplows clearing snow from the street.
- **Move parked vehicles off of the streets prior to snowfall events.** Parked cars are a hindrance to snow removal operations, requiring more time and costly return trips to effectively clear the streets. Residents are asked to move their vehicles off the street whenever snow accumulations are forecasted.
- **Remove sidewalk snow to the front yard instead of the area between the sidewalk and the curb.** This provides more snow storage capacity between the sidewalk and the curb for snow removed from the street.
- **Keep your mailbox drive-up area accessible for U.S. Mail vehicles.** Please be sure to clear snow from the curb area around your mailbox after a snowfall so that mail vehicles can access your mailbox.
- **Shovel snow from around your fire hydrant.** Please clear snow away from fire hydrants located near your property. This effort helps the Fire Department and the Water Utility to manage the water supply system and to quickly respond to emergencies.

Thank you for your assistance in the success of our winter snow removal operations.



## FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Saukville Water Department will be flushing hydrants throughout the Village between 8:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. **October 13<sup>th</sup> through October 16<sup>th</sup> & October 20<sup>th</sup> through 23<sup>rd</sup>.** There may be some discoloration in your water during this process. This is iron and is not harmful. We recommend that you do not do laundry if your water is discolored. If you forget and your clothes have a reddish appearance, **DO NOT DRY THE CLOTHES**; rather rewash in cold water to remove the discoloration. Running the tap for a short period of time will clear the lines after the flushing is complete.



## ADOPT A FIRE HYDRANT

Fire hydrants are often overlooked as requiring clearing of snow and ice. Hydrants protect YOUR property. Keeping them accessible will result in saving precious time crucial to firefighters responding to an incident in your neighborhood. After extreme amounts of snow, the Utility crews will clear the hydrants as time allows, but you can help also by clearing a hydrant near your home when you clear your driveway and sidewalk after a storm.

## WATER BILLS AND WATER LEAKS IN HOMES

Your water bills are determined by Saukville Water Utility staff reading your water meter. When your water bill becomes higher than normal, there is usually a leak in your home. 95% of all leaks are toilets and most times you cannot hear the leak. The toilet most likely to leak is the one rarely used. We recommend that you check your toilets every 6 months to make sure they are not leaking. Place a drop of natural food coloring in the tank - do not flush. Check it in 20 - 30 minutes. If color appears in the bowl, it is leaking water. You can also pick up a complimentary test kit at Village Hall. This is also a good time to operate all of your valves in your home and to start reading your meter weekly to make sure you have no leaks and that you are only billed for the water you use.



## UTILITY BILLING PAYMENT OPTION

The Village offers a credit card payment option for payment of utility bills. You can pay in person at Village Hall to utilize this service or use a secure link through the Village website (there is a charge for the website service). Also available is **automatic withdrawal** from your checking or savings account. Your quarterly payment can be deducted automatically from your selected account on the 25<sup>th</sup> of the billing month. Go to [www.village.saukville.wi.us](http://www.village.saukville.wi.us) to download the form to sign up for automatic payment. Avoid the hassle of writing checks and worrying about late fees by signing up for auto pay today!



## SUMP PUMPS

Remember to check your sump pump and make sure it is hooked up correctly to the discharge lateral and **not** to the sanitary sewer system. Per Village Ordinance, it is illegal to hook-up or discharge storm or clear water into the Village's sanitary sewer lines. Since all discharges to the sanitary sewer end up at the treatment plant, this creates additional problems to properly process the wastewater for eventual discharge to the river.

## Cross CONNECTION Inspections Continue

The Cross Connection Inspection Program is continuing throughout the Village. A Cross Connection is a direct or potential connection between any part of the public water supply system and a source of contamination or pollution. The most common form of cross connection is a garden hose, which is easily connected to the public water supply system and can be used to apply a variety of potentially dangerous substances, including chemicals and fertilizer. Other common cross connections include dishwashers, toilets, pressure washers, boilers, pools, and lawn sprinkler systems.

**In order to reduce overall costs for compliance with DNR Regulation NR810.15, the Village of Saukville Water Utility has contracted with Hydro Designs, Inc. (HDI) of New Berlin, Wisconsin to assist in managing our Cross Connection Control program.**

HDI is sending notices to, and will then perform initial inspections of, residential, commercial, and industrial buildings throughout the Village to detect actual and potential cross connections and make recommendations for the installation of backflow prevention devices or assemblies where necessary. There is no fee for the inspection, however, all costs associated with the replacement, modification, installation and/or testing of backflow prevention assemblies is the obligation of the property owner. Inspections takes less than 45 minutes on average for a business and less than 20 minutes for a home. This will help ensure that contaminated or polluted water cannot backflow into clean drinking water. You can find more info at <http://hydrodesignsinc.com>.

## MEDICATIONS

Please do not discard old medications by flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash. Save them in their original containers in a safe place. Drop them in the Med-Return Collection box located in the lobby of the Village of Saukville Police Department, Monday through Friday during normal business hours, for proper disposal.



## COLD WEATHER TIPS - PROTECT YOUR PLUMBING!

All it takes to freeze your pipes is a cold snap that drops the outside temperature below 20 degrees. When water freezes inside a pipe, it creates a blockage that causes pressure to rise. The pressure builds up and the pipe blows. Play it safe and follow some simple tips for keeping water pipes in your home warm and cozy:

- Wrap pipes with foam or fiberglass insulation.
- Seal openings in exterior walls where cold air can get to unprotected pipes.
- Disconnect garden hoses and place insulated covers over outdoor faucets. Better yet, install inside shut-off valves for outdoor faucets and drain water from pipes.
- Leave cabinet doors open to let warmer room air get to the pipes under kitchen and bath sinks.
