REVIEW A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE - PLANNING AND ZONING FOR ST. JOHN XXIII CATHOLIC CHURCH, BUILDING LOCATED AT 166 W DEKORA STREET, REQUESTED BY ST. JOHN XXIII CATHOLIC CHURCH (Business Description and Plan of Operation are attached)

Wagner stated that the proposed use is permitted in the Institutional District.


A Place To Be offers Bible Studies, Ecumenical Worship Services, Counseling that is similar to those provided by Lutheran Social Services, prayer groups and social groups as well that promote concern for others above self. So while the main support A Place To Be comes from the Catholic Church, this is truly a partnership that looks to bridge two faith communities in working together to advance Christian values and our faiths.

While this is a program supported in part by St. John's XXII Tri-parish they have many of the same social justice concerns as the United Church of Christ has and this working partnership is much the same as is the partnership that formed several years ago by Parkside UCC, Living Hope Lutheran, Christ the King Lutheran, Grand Ave. UMC and First Congregational UCC in Port Washington that jointly support a Christian Youth group that uses the buildings at Grand Ave. UMC. Each church is required to support that program in part through financial giving to UMC for the support of staff and to help maintain the facility in which the programing takes place.

We look forward to working with other denominations from around the community in working toward what might be looked at as Church re-imagined from what the traditional church may have looked like 20 to 40 years ago where we are more open to speaking and listening with open minds and hearts to others in hopes of bringing people together in a divisive world today.
